uncultivated audience of willing participants, and, potential profits from this same audience. But wait, what profits? What audience, when so many of the thousands who register are there to lurk or don't even complete? While to-now the pressure has remained mainly political, it's not exclusively so and some administrations at some very visible institutions are forging ahead without evidence of their value-add. In fact, the editors of the journal Inside Higher Ed recently released a survey of 2.251 faculty members that reveals the attitudes of faculty on technology, and 62% of faculty 'strongly agree' that institutions should start MOOCs, (with prior faculty approval) even if there's no

proof of MOOCs' effectiveness or profitability. Crushingly, just 7% of the same faculty members strongly agree that online courses can achieve student learning outcomes that are at least equivalent to those of in-person courses* even though 27% of educational technology administrators are more likely to strongly agree with the statement. Most faculty members (85%) say the quality of online courses is lower than those delivered in person with respect to class time student interaction. Where do we stand at Lehman? 

Tools for Online Learning

Online tools like the ones featured in this newsletter are educationally relevant when your students can use them to do something tangibly to help with all the resources, links and photos needed to develop a research project or presentation.

VoiceThread is now inside Blackboard 9.1 at Lehman!

As more instructors at Lehman have found a myriad of uses for VoiceThread, it's going to be good news to know that you can start your own VT community right inside your Blackboard course with just a URL link at no additional cost to you or your students!

Here's how to access VoiceThread: In Blackboard, open your 'Assignments' folder. Select 'Build content', and choose 'URL'. For the 'name' type 'VoiceThread Link'. for URL, type in:

https://lehman.voicethread.com/lti/
(this link needs the final 'slash' at the end and is ONLY accessible from within Bb.) Check the box that says 'this is a link to a tool provider'. Be sure to select 'Options' in #4 'open in new window'. You and your class are automatically registered via Blackboard's sign-in- no other sign in will be required.

For those who haven't seen this powerful group discussion tool in action, VoiceThread is a web-based (cloud) application that lets you place all kinds of media like documents, images, videos, audio files and PowerPoint presentations at the center of an asynchronous group conversation. A VoiceThread allows people to make comments using their computer's microphone, webcam and/or any mix of text, even a telephone, or uploaded audio file. VoiceThread now runs inside your Blackboard 9.1 course, so there is no software to download, install, or update.



Visit my office, call or email me for a personal training session and be up and running with your own VoiceThreads in less than a half hour. You and your students can make unlimited VT's to present - some faculty even use it as their class 'discussion board'! Come in and activate your course's copy. alyson.vogel@lehman.cuny.edu

Tools for Online Learning BlackBoard Collaborate

Located within our current version of Bb 9.1. Collaborate offers faculty and students the opportunity to collaborate with one another simultaneously and virtually. Faculty can conduct their courses through web conferencing features that incorporate instant messaging (chat), voice, white board for demonstration, document uploading and storage, live web tours and group spaces into your distance learning course to provide a real time learning experience.

It's now possible for online or hybrid course instructors to take advantage of these virtual features by creating a simple link inside Bb: Choose a content area to add the link, click 'Add Interactive Tool' from the menu, then select Bb Collaborate, Click 'Create Session.' Give the session a title, then choose a start date and time. Be sure to www.lehmancollegecuny.wikispaces.net offer early session entry' to allow your students to get settled. Don't forget to let them know the date and time! Then set the recording time to manual or auto. Practice using the tools or give us a call!


Wikispaces: Create Your Own Class Wiki in Minutes
